### **Chaplain's Chats**

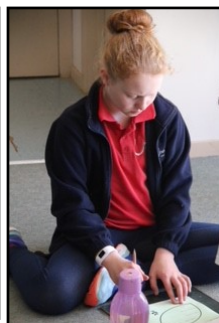
'Kindness is not a passive virtue' Eric Verissimo
