On Thursday 16th the students will sit the Reading assessment, Friday $17^{\text {th }}$ Language Conventions and on Tuesday $21^{\text {st }}$ March the numeracy assessment will complete the NAPLAN requirements. In completing the School Review process covering the past four years 2019-2022, we are asking the parent community to look at the data from the period to determine the School's achievements against the School's Strategic Plan goals and targets. We are asked to analyse the data to determine achievements against the plan determining the enablers and barriers to success. We are also asked to determine the progress and level of proficiency against the dimension of the FISO Continua Improvement, providing evidence to support the selection to proficiency level. ## Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card valid on 31st January 2023 you will be eligible to claim costs towards camps, excursions and sporting activities. Payment amounts this year are $\$ 125$ for primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school. If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.
